It was written by one of my fellow Holy Land Pilgrimage Leaders, Rev. Rhona Knight, a former GP and Trauma specialist who is now an ordained minister at Durham University.

Praying for the Holy Land and its people,

Praying for your deep peace,

Praying that swords are turned to ploughshares,

We ask that your kingdom will come on earth as in heaven.

May those in power seek your heart.

May those suffering know your presence.

May those mourning be comforted.

May we, who watch at a distance, be open to seeing with your eyes of compassion and understanding and know how to pray and respond justly, mercifully and humbly.

New Life for Old (1)

KSD Highlands for Ukraine have approached all churches in the Presbytery asking for help for those in Ukraine suffering in the on-going conflict but more specifically for those who lost everything in widespread flooding following the destruction of the Kakhova Dam this summer. A box will be left in the back corridor for requested items. Warm winter clothing for people of all ages tops the list, along with blankets, but tinned long life foods, including baby food are also included. The charity has a storage unit at Morris Leslie's yard in the Longman so we will be able to move donations there regularly. Full details will be on an accompanying poster.

New Life for Old (2)

As many of you will be aware, since we moved to on screen technology, we have many spare pew Bibles, hymn books, Crown Praise books etc. While all Bibles or hymnals with a personal dedication, all large print hymn books and those at doors or in transept pews will be retained, it's intended to pass the rest to a charity called Books 2 Africa - <u>https://books2africa.org/</u> for shipping to Africa. This will give books a renewed use with Christian congregations there who are unlikely to have access to the same level of technology.

You can help if you have any spare (modern translation) Bibles. Also if you, or your family, have any fairly recent dictionaries or textbooks - a wide range of topics and books for all ages is accepted - in English or French; these are used in educational settings. There will be a box left out for any donations in the back corridor; we would wish to send these by the end of November.


Leprosy Mission Afternoon Tea





The oratorio depicts and celebrates the Creation of the World as narrated in the Book of Genesis. Haydn composed 'The Creation' following a period spent in England where he heard and was impressed by the oratorios of Handel. Occasional passages of the oratorio are not unlike that of Handel.
