Church Conference Report

The conference was held in Crown Church with 48 delegates attending. Opening devotions were led by Pat Crippin who also played the piano.

The morning's business started with three presentations. Firstly, Rev Douglas Robertson drew attention to the word mission being a translation of service and that our combined efforts as a congregation make up the arms, legs and body of Christ.

Secondly, Eileen Ardern spoke about developing activities under the five marks of mission and allowing this to affect our attitudes as we work for all who come to our church. Each one of us being on a faith journey where we help others on that journey too.

Thirdly, Bob Forrest reminded us that the 20/20 project has motivated many and helped many to progress on their faith journeys while being involved, doing whatever they can and staying focused on mission.

The morning's activity for delegates was to go into discussion groups created for the day: Worship & Discipleship; Pastoral Care including Youth & Children; Community & Outreach; Environmental Issues; Communications and Fabric. Delegates broke into groups and discussed the following questions: (1) what will this group aim to do and how will it keep focused on mission? (2) Outline a remit? (3) Brainstorm ideas which this group could undertake in the next year or two? After discussion time each group then reported back in plenary session.

There was then a welcome break for soup & sandwiches followed by tea and cakes, served upstairs by helpers from the Olive Grove.

After lunch there was a short presentation given by Brian Macgill about getting missional. The afternoon's task was to consider two questions: (1) Where I am right now with regard to mission? and (2) Prepare a 'mission hat' profile for each member of your group?. The responses, reported back in plenary session, varied according to the interpretation of the instructions but in all was received well. There was time to answer remaining questions and complete other 'post-it' note suggestions. After which, Rev Douglas Robertson made some closing remarks.

Lastly, there was a short service of Communion led by Rev Morven Archer and the conference day brought to an end with a blessing.

Feb 4-10

Pray for peace in our world; that all people may live free from violence, in safety and security, and with hope for the future. Pray for resolution and an end to the ongoing conflict particularly in the Middle East, and between Ukraine and Russia.




