Update from Crown 20/20 Group

"Crown Church aims to invest in a major upgrade of our church buildings to provide a warm and welcoming home for worship, equip us with modern and accessible Facilities to support Christian outreach into our community and to help our church meet the needs of that community."

Dear Members of the Congregation

It has been quite a journey over the past three years, but the Crown 20/20 Group is nearing the completion of the first phase of our ambitious renewal project at the church.

Once work is completed in the Sanctuary to upgrade the lighting and install a state-ofthe-art audio visual system, we will take a breather and reflect on the significant progress we have made in upgrading the church building and providing modern and accessible facilities for our congregation and the wider community.

We estimate that the investment in our buildings, via the new Crown Primary School nursery in the lower hall and related refurbishments, the installation of the lift and the removal of asbestos, together with the refurbishment of the upper hall and all the work in the Sanctuary comes to more than \pounds 1.7 million.

Given our forthcoming link with Old High/St Stephen's, we believe it is time to take a breather with the redevelopment of the buildings. Future decisions will be made by the new congregation.

Meanwhile, we can report that we recently received a delivery of almost 40 boxes from Rosehill, delivering - at long last – some of the chairs we ordered in November, last year.

We still await the majority of chairs we ordered with arms and hopefully they will be with us soon. The arrival of 70 chairs without arms came almost at the same time we were asked to return the chairs and tables which we had borrowed from Dingwall Town Hall! Our grateful thanks go the Town Hall staff for the loan and for their patience! The new chairs are stacked and stored temporarily in the vestry. While the work is progressing in the Sanctuary with the lighting, the audio visual equipment upgrade will also be installed, and we look forward to trouble-free streaming of services as well as high quality projection to a new main screen. And to finish it all off, while the scaffolding is up, the insulation in the attic of the Sanctuary will be much improved. We can only apologise for being out of the Sanctuary for a few weeks, but we hope you agree the wait will be worth the inconvenience experienced. In the November Newsletter, when the first phase of the redevelopment is completed, we will catalogue all the work that has been undertaken at the church since we began our project. Thank you again for your support throughout our journey.

October 16-22

The health of loved ones has been a significant concern throughout this year. Thank God for His faithful presence in worrying as well as joyful times. Oh God of compassion, be close to those who are ill, afraid or in isolation. In their loneliness, be their consolation; in their anxiety, be their hope; in their darkness be their light; through him who suffered alone on the cross, but reigns with you in glory, Jesus Christ our Lord. Lord, help us not to lean on our own understanding but in everything acknowledge You so that You can direct our words, thoughts and actions, In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Pray for each and every member of the congregation, that God's spirit continues to flow throughout their lives whatever their circumstances; Pray that each of us will place God at the centre of our lives and seek Him and His purpose in our lives.

<u>October 30 – November 5</u>

Loving Father, help us to trust You when we have financial worries. Open our eyes to those around us who need our help and give us the courage and opportunities to be generous. Amen. Give thanks for the Lord's promise that says when we are weak He makes us strong and that when we are weary and heavy burdened we can go to Him and He will make us strong and give us peace.

ACORN Meeting Church Lounge Wednesday 19th October at 7.30pm

A few of us has been meeting together via Zoom and in person to explore a new way of exploring about discipleship known as **ACORN**. ACORN is based on praying to God and asking Him to help us in reaching out and being a blessing to others, based on the following:



This is based on the work of the missiologist Vincent Donovan who wrote the book Christianity Rediscovered, wherein he said 'we make the mistake as Christians of thinking we are taking God with us into any given situation'.

God is already there. Our job is to find out what God is doing and join God in that conversation.' God then reveals deeper hurts, desires and opening for the Gospel.

Christians then frequently gather to disciple and encourage each other by just seeing how they are and find out what God might be doing. We are not called to (necessarily) tell them the Gospel, but join God in His work in them and figure out where they might be on the Engel Scale.

The basic idea behind an ACORN group is that God is always prompting us to make connections with other people, so it's our job to listen and act.

At the time of writing, I am enjoying two weeks in Sydney, Australia, and here I witnessed something that disturbed me.

Sydney is a modern, progressive city. Wherever I look, there are beautifully-designed high-rise office blocks and shopping malls offering expensive designer clothes and goods bearing the sought-after logos of all sorts of luxury brands. There is nothing intrinsically wrong with any of that.

But there is another side to the city: homelessness and rough sleeping. I am talking about folk who "carry their home in two carrier bags", and often their only friend is a dog.

Wealth and poverty exist side by side.

So, what was it that touched me? It is that I came upon the bed of a homeless person. The bed was makeshift, and the 'owner' was absent. The bed looked clean, and the absent 'owner' had made it with great care.

The 'owner' of the bed had seemingly lost much, perhaps all they ever had, and was at rock bottom. Although they had lost much, they had not lost their sense of pride. It did not matter that they had lost everything: they valued what they had, even if it was not much.

Food for thought!




A Date for your Diary

Alex features in Inverness Football Memories Project




A project to chart the history of football in Inverness since the first clubs were formed in 1885 features our very own Alex Grant, who played for Inverness Thistle and Caledonian in the 1950s and 1960s.

Alex's memories are recorded at <u>www.ambaile.org.uk/inverness-football-memories</u>. Am Baile is the history and culture web site of High Life Highland, who are partnering Inverness Caledonian Thistle Community Trust in promoting the project.

Alex played as a winger, mostly on the right, with Inverness Thistle between 1954-59 and Caledonian (1959-63). Alex recalls some memories of his career, including the day a Highland League game ended with a rope acting as a crossbar after it snapped under the weight of a goalie who had swung on it.

Alex has been providing invaluable advice and guidance on the project, which is being led by another member of our congregation, Gordon Fyfe, who is Joint Chair of the ICT Community Trust. Gordon played for Caledonian for 9 years in the 1970s.
