THOUGHTS FROM REV JAMES

So I'm writing this on Tuesday 29th, just after what is known in the church as Low Sunday.

Low Sunday refers to the second Sunday of Easter, the Sunday immediately following Easter Sunday. It's often called Low Sunday because attendance is typically lower than on Easter Sunday, and the celebration may be considered less intense or "low-key" compared to the high festival of Easter. It's the time of year where you can't move at the Crieff Hydro without bumping into a Minister trying to get a weekend away, and it's traditionally hard to get pulpit supply.

For Susan and I, it was a high, as we hit the pavements of London for the marathon. We survived the heat and while we would have preferred a slightly faster time, the heat was unbearable. But we persevered over the finish line. And for thousands of others like us who took to the streets of London and Manchester this weekend we got the high of the crowds cheering us along. Thanks to everyone who supported us. We've now raised just shy of £8,000 for the work of Maggie's.

When it comes to church though, I don't really feel comfortable calling any Sunday "low". We are still in the season of Easter, and still should be celebrating the glorious resurrection as Jesus left the tomb and left death behind for all of us. There's nothing low about that.

Happy Easter. Now if you'll excuse me, I need to stretch.
